Concussions and head injuries are commonly reported injuries in children and adolescents who participate in sports and other recreational activities

According to the CDC each year hundreds of thousands of K-12 students sustain a concussion as a result of injuries from activities that may or may not be sports related. A concussion is a type of traumatic brain injury (TBI) that results from a bump, blow, or jolt to the head (or by a hit to the body) that causes the head and brain to move rapidly back and forth. This sudden movement can cause the brain to bounce around or twist in the skull, stretching and damaging the brain cells and creating chemical changes in the brain. Signs and symptoms of concussion generally show up soon after the injury. However, a concussion is an evolving injury. The full effect of the injury may not be noticeable at first and some symptoms may not show up for hours or days.


It is very important that if your child has been diagnosed with a concussion that you report this to the school nurse before his/ her return to school. We are mindful that the concussion may affect the student's ability to learn. Concussions affect people differently. Most students will have symptoms that last for a few days or a week and recover quickly and fully. A more serious concussion can last for weeks, months or even longer. We want to make sure that in the event of a concussion your child is supported and is able to maintain his/her academic responsibilities while recovering. Please be sure to keep us informed in the event this ever happens to your child.
